

Idaho's Journey for Diversity and Human Rights Strategies for Sustainability

October 1-2, 2009—Coeur d'Alene, Idaho

Idaho's Journey for Diversity and Human Rights begins in Coeur d'Alene, continuing north from there with two intense days of travel, exploring the roots of the peoples who live there and their human rights challenges and successes. Idaho's Journey is open to all, including those in business, social services, government, the arts, law, health, and education, as well as students, retirees and other community members.

This year's Journey focuses on strategies for sustainability in Idaho, including issues of economic and environmental justice:

- Economic justice is a core human rights value, including issues such as living wages for workers and inclusiveness in housing and employment.
- Environmental justice is the assurance of a clean and healthy living environment for all, including future generations.

Don't miss this chance to explore the sites and concerns of North Idaho including:

- How Idaho tribes and state and local government have worked together for environmental clean-up and species protection.
- Strategies for affordable housing, economic justice, and a sustainable lifestyle in Idaho communities
- Tribal rights to the land and strategies for environmental quality.
- An overnight stay on beautiful Lake Pend Oreille.

Day 1: October 1, 10am: Journey begins at the Human Rights Education Institute in Coeur d'Alene, ID, including presentation on the tribal-state partnership to clean up Lake Coeur d'Alene and its tributaries; Long term sustainability for Northern Idaho communities and the Kootenai tribe's stand-off for tribal recognition and lands.

Day 2: October 2, 9am - 4pm: Including visit to the Kootenai Tribal Sturgeon Hatchery in Bonners Ferry, discussion of the partnership between the Kootenai Tribe and local government for environmental quality in the Kootenai Valley; return to Coeur d'Alene.

Workshop fees and registration: Idaho's Journey fees cover meals (Except dinner 10/1), transportation, and overnight accommodations.

- Workshop fees are \$100 for registrations by September 18 2009, and are \$120 thereafter. All rates are for double occupancy hotel room. Add \$20 for a single room.
- Space is limited in the workshop, so early registration is encouraged. No enrollments are accepted after September 24, 2009.
- Idaho's Journey is available for UI course credit (1 unit) or for Professional Development credit for Idaho teachers—see syllabus at www.agls.uidaho.edu/idahojourney. Tuition fees are in addition to the workshop fees. See registration form for details.
